Abstract (10, bold & Italic)- *The abstract should summarize the content of the paper. Text of the abstract should be 200 words without references. The font size is 10 with Italic style.*

Keywords (10, Bold, Italic) - *About five key words in alphabetical order, separated by comma. The font size is 10 with Italic style.*

Introduction (12, Bold)

Beginning with a new page, it should explain the nature of the problem, previous work, purpose, and the contribution of the paper. The stuffing should be understood easily about the paper. The running matter should be in 1.5 lines spacing with justify alignment. The manuscript Font style must in Times new Roman. **(12, 1.5 spacing)**

Headings

Each manuscript should be divided in to the following main headings: **Introduction, Materials and methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgement, References** (Typed in bold capital, 12). All headings from the Introduction to Acknowledgements are numbered sequentially using 1, 2, 3, etc.

Subheadings (12, bold & Italic)

Subheadings should be in italics (bold & 12). Do not underline any of the headings, or add dashes, colons, etc.

Figures and Tables

Figures and photos should be in good quality. Photographs should be sharp, of high contrast with an indication of the scale. Figure captions appear below the figure, are flush left, and are in lower case letters. Figures should be numbered in the order they appear in the text. Table captions appear centered above the table in upper and lower case letters. Tables should be self-contained and have a descriptive title.

Citing Tables, Figures and references in the text

Text with figures (*Fig. 1*) and tables (*Table 1*) Should in italics. When a reference has one, the author's surname may be integrated into the text, followed by the year of publication in parentheses (Author, 2009); For two authors, (Jhon and Airia, 1986); When the reference has three or more authors, use the Latin expression “*et al.*” and include the year (Edward *et al.*, 1990); For two or more articles using the same within-text citation, add a distinguishing letter (a, b, c, etc.) to the year in both text and Literature Cited (William, 2005a; William, 2005b) Alternatively When the same author(s) has two references in different years; write them in chronological order (Domingush, 1988; 1990).

Acknowledgements

An acknowledgement section may be presented after the conclusion, if required.

References

This heading is not assigned a number. A reference list **MUST** be included using the following information. Only *cited* text references are included.. References **must in** alphabetical order.
